The results of the 2018 ICF North Texas election were announced at the ICF-NT Annual Meeting on November 10, 2017. In compliance with the ICF-NT bylaws and election process, Full Members in Good Standing of ICF-NT shall receive an electronic ballot no later than November 1 in the year in which the election takes place. In meeting this requirement, an email with a link to the 2018 slate was sent out to all Full Members in Good Standing on Monday, October 30, 2017. The voting period extended to Thursday, November 9, 2017. The board approved the election results on November 10, 2017.

## Pro Bono Coaching at the Texas Conference for Women

The Texas Conference for Women is an annual event in Austin that offers attendees the opportunity to experience pro bono laser coaching. In past years, non-ICF coaches were invited because ICF Austin could not provide enough coaches to meet the need. Austin chapter president Kelley Russell-DuVarney took a leap of faith and told conference organizers they did not need to invite non-ICF coaches this year because she would bring enough ICF coaches. Our North Texas chapter plus Austin and San Antonio provided additional coaches for the event, so it was an all-ICF volunteer core for the first time! Kudos to Kelley for realizing that vision and for organizing the first collaborative event to include all four Texas chapters.

This year's conference took place on November 9. Bev Wright, Lisa Seay, Sandi Mitchell, Dara Rossi, and Amy Dynda represented North Texas. Sandi provided the following firsthand account.

"7,500 women (and a few brave men) attended the 18th Texas Conference for Women in Austin this week! Speakers included the amazing Anita Hill, who stands for the right of girls and women to not be harassed or abused. Sheryl Sandberg and Adam Grant talked about building the resilience muscle needed to live through the 'Option B's' in our life. Viola Davis shared the testimonial of her journey from being the child of an alcoholic father and living in condemned housing to being a hero to millions of women and sharing the elixir of knowledge gleaned from her life.

"In addition to the phenomenal speakers, ICF coaches from all four Texas chapters came together and coached 155 hours, 20 minutes at a time (2-3 'clients' per coaching hour). It was a great experience and I look forward to more opportunities to partner with our other Texas ICF chapter. For example - our first ICF All-Texas Conference & Retreat in April 2018!"

## ICF All-Texas Coaches Retreat and Conference April 6–8 Spaces Are Limited – Register by December 15!

ICF chapters from North Texas, Greater Austin, Houston, and San Antonio are collaborating to present a Coaches Retreat and Conference that will take place Friday through Sunday, April 6-8, 2018 in the Hill Country outside of Austin. The retreat will be designed similar to the arc of a coaching session, from establishing the agreement for a clear outcome, through self-exploration to create awareness, to designing specific takeaway actions to bring the experience into daily life.

## 2017 ICF-NT Annual Meeting: "Celebrate You Home"

## 2017 ICF-NT Annual Meeting: "Celebrate You Home"

On November 10, 2017, the ICF North Texas chapter gathered to celebrate its members and the best of our chapter's past, present and future. The program was hosted by Chapter President, Jude Olson, PhD, ACC and ICF Global Board Director Sara Smith, MCC. Before the formal portion of the meeting started, Jude asked everyone to write down on the index cards provided on the tables one 2017 highlight at ICF-NT and one dream for the chapter in 2018.

#### History of our Chapter

Looking back to our founding history brought up the rich legacy of our chapter. First formed in 1995-96 by Judy Feld and Pam Straus as the North Texas Coaches Association, the Association had its first meeting of 14 attendees at Anne Marie's Kitchen in Dallas. When Thomas Leonard launched the new International Coach Federation (ICF) in 1996, North Texas Coaches asked to become the first official ICF chapter with the name ICF North Texas. On May 10, 1996, ICF North Texas became the first official ICF chapter, with a meeting at the Bill Bates Cowboy Grill in Dallas. 1996 is our chapter's anniversary year!

In 2003, under Judy Womack's presidency, ICF-NT became an ICF Charter Chapter per ICF guidelines as a nonprofit. Judy Feld played a leadership role in the chapter, serving as President for the first five years with Pam Straus, with Jodi Jan and then with Ginger Cockerham. Following this, Ginger served as President for the next two years. Judy served on the ICF Global board 2001-02, and was President in 2003. Ginger Cockerham served on the ICF Global board for seven years as a director from 2002-2006, and was Board Vice President in 2007 and 2008. She served on the ICF Foundation board for three years from 2008 through 2010.

#### Tribute to Ginger Cockerham, MCC

To honor Ginger Cockerham who passed away in 2017, the ICF-NT chapter gave tribute to her at the annual meeting. Members who knew Ginger shared stories and fond memories of her sense of humor, spirit, and passion for coaching and the chapter. Jude presented Ginger's son with a commemorative tribute to Ginger in appreciation for her long-time leadership and lasting contribution to the coaching profession, its institutions, and coaches everywhere. Her legacy will live on in the resources and books that her family so generously donated to the chapter. We will share these with members at our 2018 luncheon meetings.

#### **Past Presidents Honored**

The chapter has such a powerful resource to tap into in its past presidents. To acknowledge their leadership and ongoing contribution to the chapter, all past presidents in attendance were asked to stand so they could be acknowledged by chapter members. Eleven of the eighteen past presidents were on hand and they all stepped forward to receive a Presidential Mug (of Mount Rushmore) from Jude to thank them for their service.

#### Distinguished Service Award - First One Awarded by the Chapter!

The annual meeting showcased the newly created Distinguished Service Award, given in recognition of distinguished service to the chapter and the coaching profession. The award, a best practice "borrowed" in 2016 from the Minnesota ICF chapter on engaging and retaining long-term members, has been two years in the making. Both the nominating coach and the coach being nominated must be active ICF-NT members in good standing and hold a current ICF credential. ICF-NT chapter volunteers developed the four selection criteria: contribution to ICF-NT, contribution to the coaching profession, being a role model for other coaches, and demonstrating professionalism of coaching.

#### Winner of Distinguished Service Award – JUDY FELD!

The three nominees for the award were Jim Cooper, PCC; Judy Feld, MCC; and Sara Smith, MCC—all exceptional members of the chapter. Judy Feld was presented with the Distinguished Service Award.

Besides being one of the chapter's founders, serving on the ICF Global board and establishing past presidents' advisory councils at ICF-NT and ICF Global, Judy was founding co-editor and publisher, with Thomas Leonard, of *Coaching News*, the ICF e-newsletter. One of the first 20 coaches to receive MCC designation on its inception in 1998, Judy is a Certified Mentor Coach and has mentored over 100 coaches, including ICF-NT past presidents. Co-founder of the Executive and Professional Coaching Program at UTD in 2005, Judy served on the faculty, led the Coaching Practicum, and managed faculty training as well as credentialing for the ICF Accredited Coach Training Program (ACTP). She also was instrumental in the creation of the Prism-Award-winning coaching initiative in UTD's Executive MBA program.

## Top Ten Highlights of 2017

Jude listed the top ten highlights of 2017 and each board member shared a mini summary of accomplishments. In brief, 2017 was a productive and healthy year for the chapter. Membership growth is up by 15% with 22 new members. We are in good shape financially moving into 2018 with increased revenues. Newly formed LINC groups are thriving. The variety of programs and presenters are attracting members to the monthly meetings, with attendance up by 26%. This past year, we offered 26 CEUs in programming (13.5 Resource Development and 12.5 Core Competency). And, we awarded credentials to 22 members (13 ACC, 8 PCC and 1 MCC) bringing us to 6 MCCs in our ICF-NT Chapter! Members continue to be afforded opportunities for pro bono coaching, and the president's club is an invaluable resource for the board and the chapter. For 2018, a communications plan is underway to develop more sophisticated platforms for interacting and engaging.
